Dear Nursing Colleague:

The purpose of this letter is to seek your organization's endorsement of the *Criteria for the Evaluation of Clinical Nurse Specialist Master's, Practice Doctorate, and Post-Graduate Certificate Educational Programs*.

This project was designed to develop and disseminate criteria to guide the development, implementation and evaluation of Clinical Nurse Specialist (CNS) programs in the U.S.

This project adapted a previously-validated consensus-building process (US Department of Health and Human Service, 2002) that was initially developed in consultation with a nationally-recognized expert in higher education assessment and used to develop and validate national consensus-based primary care nurse practitioner competencies in five specialty areas (APRN Consensus Work Group, 2008). The current project utilized the expertise of a variety of stakeholders and included assessment of current documents and existing models to inform the process and anticipate barriers to implementing the final recommendations. An NACNS Board-appointed Task Force of experts developed the initial document (referred to as *Guidelines*), and the NACNS Board then appointed the Validation Panel, whose members represented various stakeholder groups and organizations, to provide input and validation and to revise the initial *Guidelines* as needed.
