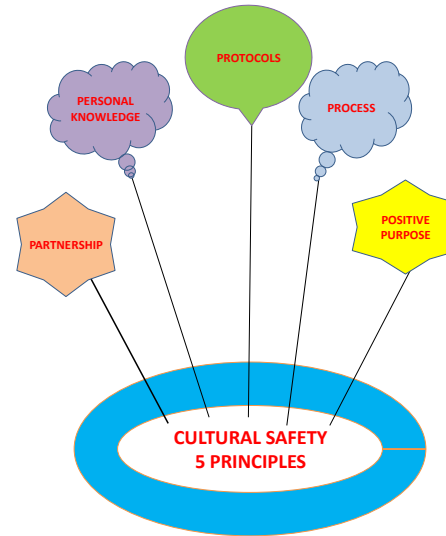

What is a Culture of Safety
 An organization commitment to maintain safety at all levels, from frontline providers to managers and to executives

Elements of a Culture Safety
 A patient safety culture is non-punitive, emphasize accountability, excellence, honesty, integrity and mutual respect

- Culture of Safety**
- Safe work environment
 - Organizational approach to risk assessment and error management
 - Use of Nursing Sensitive Indicator Data (eg. nosocomial infections, pain, falls, decubiti, and PIV infiltrations)
- Quality Care Monitoring and Improvements**
- Allocation of resources to improve quality of care
 - Dissemination of quality data to frontline staff
